

## ASAS Graduate Student Competition: M.S. and Ph.D. Division

Students must be enrolled in a Master of Science Program at an accredited university at the time of abstract submission. Each university will be limited to one (1) M.S. student competitor and one (1) Ph.D. student competitor in each graduate student oral competition (i.e., one M.S. competitor and one Ph.D. competitor). Participating students or their advisor must be a current ASAS member. Competition abstract submissions are restricted to **ONE** per student.

Participating students must be listed as the presenting author and substitutions are not allowed. In the event that a student is unable to present his/her abstract and a presenting author substitution is required, the abstract will be presented in a general session. ASAS retains the right to move abstracts out of a competition and into a general session.

Abstracts of students for oral presentations must be submitted by November 8, 2019.

## ASAS Undergraduate Student Competition

Students must be enrolled in an undergraduate program at an accredited university at the time of abstract submission. Participating students or their advisor must be a current ASAS member. Competition abstract submissions are restricted to **ONE** per student.

Participating students must be listed as the presenting author and substitutions are not allowed. In the event that a student is unable to present his/her abstract and a presenting author substitution is required, the abstract will be presented in a general session. ASAS retains the right to move abstracts out of a competition and into a general session.

Abstracts of students e-posters and oral presentations must be submitted by November 8, 2019. Student's e-posters must be submitted by February 12, 2020 or their abstract will be withdrawn from the competition.
