- Abstracts submitted will be accepted as podium presentations.
- AANA will accept up to three (3) abstracts per presenter. Please ensure that all email addresses of the presenters are accurate, as this will be the sole method of communication regarding acceptance.
- Education sessions will be 60-120 minutes in length, including time for participant question and answer. Note: The AANA has the right to change the allotted amount of time upon acceptance.
- Abstracts are reviewed and graded blindly by the AANA Education Committee and invited expert graders.

The AANA is a non-profit organization, and therefore speaker honoraria are limited. Presenters will be reimbursed for travel and accommodations in accordance with AANA policy.
