



## Emergency Nursing 2020 Video Submissions

The 2020 annual meeting will showcase video submissions which may include documentaries, narratives, shorts, public service announcements, educational videos, animations, and related videos that demonstrate, educate, inspire, and encourage a positive impact on emergency nursing.

We welcome submissions from around the world that explore and highlight organizational, local, national, and global nursing content from an independent, organizational, community-created, and/ or interdisciplinary perspective. Although footage must be thoughtfully executed, using personal devices such as an iPhone to shoot your film is acceptable.

ALL those interested in showcasing their film at EN20 must first submit a short video (up to 3 minutes) proposal through the call for content submission site. Video Proposals will be peer reviewed and scored for official selection.

### Submitting a video proposal

Upload your video proposal/ multimedia file to the **video proposal task**; submissions should include either a verbal or written synopsis (or summary) with the following information:

- Description of the submission
- Intended audience
- Supporting evidence or objective for the film's message
- Mention of campaigns or programs that are linked to the film (if any to date)

### Video eligibility

Eligible submissions should meet the following criteria:

- Address a nursing related issue
- Be produced within the last three years
- Be accessible to an English language audience

### Selected submissions must meet the following guidelines:

- Submitter must be affiliated with the film.
- Films can be submitted in any viewable format, however if the video is accepted it must be converted into an MP4. Submitter will be provided instructions for uploading if selected.
- **Length of final film can be no more than 15 minutes.**
- Submissions must reflect credible, evidence-based facts and recommendations and must not misrepresent or distort facts.
- Submitters are responsible for obtaining consent from their organization, patients, employees, or anyone featured in the video

**Notice:** You do not have to be a member of ENA to submit a video proposal. However, all those selected to screen their film will be required to attend the EN20 annual meeting in Las Vegas to introduce their film. Discounted conference registration will be provided to the primary submitter.
