

NatCon General Call and Research Symposium Questions

All submitters must first select the type of presentation and the focus of their topic from the lists below.

- **Workshop Presentations**-Workshop presentations last 1 hour, including Q&A. They are interactive and produce identifiable outcomes. They may have one presenter, multiple presenters or can be formulated as a panel.
- **Lunch 'N' Learns**- Lunch 'n' Learn sessions are 1-hour, informal presentations with one to two speakers who lead engaging discussions. Participants pick up their lunches in the Solutions Pavilion beforehand and eat during the presentation.
- **iPoster Presentations**- Posters presentations are displays of innovative practices and award-winning programs, documents and ideas/questions. Electronic posters are created by poster presenters in the months leading up to the conference. The platform allows for users to insert graphics, audio, video, images, etc. The posters are customizable to allow for some creativity and are viewable by all conference attendees via touch screens during the entire conference. Poster presenters will be scheduled to "present" their poster during a 30-minute poster session where they are stationed at their poster on one of the touch screens. These sessions allow for conference attendees to ask questions and discuss the content of the poster with the presenter(s). Attendees last year really enjoyed this one-on-one interaction at NatCon19.
- **TED-style Talks**- TED-style Talks are short, powerful talks on riveting topics lasting just 15 minutes or less.
- **Ignite Sessions**- Ignite sessions are exactly 5 minutes with 20 auto-advancing, highly-visual slides allowing presenters to share their passions and or stories in riveting, moving and memorable ways.

General NatCon Call for Presentations Checklist

- 1. Speaker Information: (ALL SUBMISSIONS)**
 - a. Provide first name, last name, email address (*for staff submissions only you can use a dummy email address of First name last initial @test.com*), and role for proposed presenters
 - b. Sessions can have a maximum of 3 presenters and one moderator.
- 2. Complete a session description no longer than 300 words that addresses the following (300 words max): (WORKSHOPS and LUNCH N' LEARN SUBMISSIONS)**
 - a. Statement of the Problem: Build the case for why your presentation is important by outlining a brief "statement of the problem" (i.e., scope). In other words, why is this session necessary?
 - b. Problem Solving: Describe how your sessions' information helps attendees manage the problem(s) described in your statement of the problem.
 - c. Session Topics: Briefly describe your session's content; this is generally a re-hash of the major section heading and the topics outlined in the learning objectives.
 - d. Target Audience: Articulate your target audience.

NatCon Technology Shark Tank Submission Checklist

- 1. Speaker Information:**
 - a. Provide first name, last name, email address, and role for proposed presenters
 - b. Submission can have a maximum of 2 presenters.

- 2. Shark Tank Submission Content**
 - a. **Provide a short description of your product or idea** (250 words max)
 - b. **How are or would people use it?** (100 words max)
 - c. **What outcomes are you seeing or expecting?** (100 words max)
 - d. **What drove you to develop this product or idea?** (75 words max)
 - e. **What challenge are you addressing with this innovation?** (75 words max)

Research Symposium Submission Checklist

- 1. Speaker Information:**
 1. Provide first name, last name, email address, and role for proposed presenters
 2. Sessions can have a maximum of 3 presenters and one moderator.

- 2. Scientific Abstract Content**
 - a. **Presentation Title-** A proposal must have a short, specific presentation title (containing no abbreviations) that indicates the nature of the presentation (words max)

 - b. **Research Questions/Hypothesis:** Provide a brief background and describe study objectives, hypothesis tested, and/or problem addressed (250 words max)

 - c. **Description of Intervention Tested** (1000 words max)

 - d. **Research Methodology:** Describe study design, including setting, sample, sample size, subjects, intervention, and/or type of statistical analysis (1000 words max)

 - e. **Results & Conclusion-** Summarize essential results as clearly as possible with appropriate statistical analysis. Interpret the study findings. Conclusions must be supported by the results. Concisely summarize implications of the results (500 words max)
