



CALL FOR PRESENTATION CHECKLIST

Before completing the submission, please compile the required information noted in this checklist.
Incomplete proposals will not be reviewed for acceptance.

★ **All presentations must be based on literature that demonstrates best practices in the field of IDD/MH. Submissions can focus on a variety of subject areas for children and adults, including but not limited to:** *Systems Collaboration; Policy Initiatives; Aging; Counseling & Therapy; Family Issues; Diagnosis & Assessment; MH Services for those who are Nonverbal; Direct Support Professional Training (Behavior Support, MH Basics, etc.); Research; Program Models; Ethics; Trauma; IDD & Criminal Justice System; Crisis Response; Traumatic Brain Injury; Autism Spectrum Disorder; Anxiety & IDD; Syndromes; Substance Abuse and IDD; Transition (Employment, Higher Education); Technology Innovations; Gender Identity and Sexuality; IDD and Cultural and Linguistic Diversity*

★ **Presentations by families and Direct Support Professionals are encouraged.**

★ **Other topic areas are encouraged as well, and all presentations should focus on mental wellness for persons with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities.**

Indicate Presentation Category (select one)

1. **Presentation/Skill Building Workshop:** 90-minute sessions or 3-hour, skill-building workshops with a primary focus on the sharing of information in a focused topic area. Examples of topics are program models, research/evaluation studies, specific treatment methods or services. (See submission form for further topics.) Note: There is a limit of three (3) presenters maximum for these sessions.
2. **Research Symposia:** Three, 30-minute presentations will be combined into one (1) 90-minute symposium with a primary focus on sharing research findings and implications. Appropriate topics include reporting results and implications of basic or applied research studies or program evaluation.
3. **Poster Session:** Bulletin boards and/or tables provide presenters with the environment to share their information with presenters and conference attendees. The poster session will take place during the welcome reception on Thursday evening of the conference. Poster sessions will be judged and a research award given.
