Responsibilities

PWG members will meet for 1-2 conference calls between July 2019 and March 2020 and will meet in-person in September 2019 and are expected to complete the following tasks:

- Review sessions in first round of review – **Aug. 12 – Aug. 23, 2019**
- Review approx. 100 proposals in preparation for the Program Working Group retreat – **September 2019**
- Attend GSCE Program Retreat in Portland, OR – **September 2019**
 - Select completed sessions from those submitted through Call
 - Identify key topic area holes in program and help develop invited sessions to fill those
 - Identify commonality in accepted sessions and develop GSCE Tracks
- Attend GSCE 2020 in Portland, OR (**March 2-4, 2020**)

Time Commitment

Bi-weekly conference calls and one in-person meeting. Volunteer time is estimated at 2-12 hours per month over the time of the working group.

Term Limits

Please note that USGBC policy states that individuals may not serve on more than three USGBC committees and two working groups at any one time. Any one member organization may not have more than one representative on any one Committee and, except for federal government agencies, may have representatives on a maximum of five Committees and four Working Groups at any one time. Additionally, individuals are limited to four consecutive years on any one committee or working group.
