

What information do I need to nominate a resident?

Residents at AAMC member institutions are eligible for the award. Service activity to be considered should have occurred during the term of residency or fellowship training, though the awardee may have completed residency by the time of the nomination. Residents can self-nominate, or nominations can be put forward by any member of the AAMC community, including faculty, staff, administrators, residents, and students.

Nominators who put forth a nomination on behalf of a resident should be prepared to fill out the submission form, and attest to the nominee's professional ethics and scientific integrity to the best of their knowledge.

To facilitate easy entry please note that the following submission fields are required:

- Describe in full detail the nature of the community service activity.
- Describe how the activity has impacted the community local to the training institution.
- What charity of choice does the nominee wish to receive the monetary donation?
Please include the nonprofit's organization name, primary contact's full name, street address, city/state/zip, contact phone number, email, and website addresses.
- A pdf copy of the resident's CV.

Awardees and Honorees Must Embody the Standards of Professional Ethics and Scientific Integrity

- Criteria.** All AAMC awards and honors, including those awarded by the AAMC Board of Directors and AAMC-affiliated affinity groups, include a criterion that the recipient(s) must demonstrate the standards of professional ethics and scientific integrity.
- Nominations.** Individuals making a nomination for an award must attest to the nominee's professional ethics and scientific integrity to the best of their knowledge, including their personal knowledge of the nominee's demonstration of the highest standards of professional ethics and scientific integrity as well as publicly known findings by authoritative bodies.
