

SLAS2016 Call for Abstracts Frequently Asked Questions

1. How do I login to the abstract submission site?

The SLAS2016 Call for Abstracts submission site is NOT linked with your SLAS.org membership login.

If it is your first time visiting the site, please create an account beginning by clicking the 'Create An Account' button on the SLAS2016 submission site main page. Follow the prompts to create an account.

If you have already created an account, login using your email address and access key provided previously.

2. I think I already have a login, but I have forgotten my access details. What should I do?

If you have lost your access key, click the 'Lost Your Access Key' link below the access key entry box, and then enter your email address to have it resent.

If you still need help, please contact Technical Support using the dropdown at the top of the screen or the information at the end of this document.

3. How do I submit an abstract?

An abstract submission consists of multiple parts including, but not limited to, primary presenter details (one per abstract), contact information, abstract title, abstract text, award inclusions and co-author details.

4. Can I edit my abstract at a later date?

Yes. **However**, the category submission deadline is the deadline for abstract modifications and the system will not permit changes past that date. You can use the access information in your confirmation email to access your account and edit your abstract.

5. When will I be notified of acceptance?

- Those submitting an abstract for podium presentation consideration will be notified of acceptance in late-September.
- Those who have submitted for either podium or poster consideration will be notified of podium status in late-September and/or poster status in late-October.
- Those submitting for poster consideration only will be notified of acceptance beginning in late-October and then on a rolling basis thereafter until the program is full or the final deadline (January 23, 2016) has passed.

Confirmations will be sent to the Primary Presenter listed on the abstract submission, *NOT* the submitter.

NOTE: Tony B. Travel Award applicants for podium AND poster will be notified by early/mid-October.

6. Is there a limit to the number of abstracts I can submit?

While there is no limit to the number of abstracts one person can submit, **there IS a limit to the number of presentations a Primary Presenter can present.** A single individual (Primary Presenter) may only present one (1) podium talk and up to two (2) poster presentations (one per day).

As it pertains to poster abstract submissions, if a single individual is listed on more than two (2) poster abstract submissions, the Program Committee will review the first two submissions *ONLY* and any additional submissions beyond two (2) will be automatically withdrawn.

7. Is there a limit on the number of authors I can assign to a single abstract?

No, there is no limit on the number of co-authors you can add to a single abstract, but each abstract may only have one (1) Primary Presenter assigned. It is the responsibility of the Primary Presenter to communicate with the co-authors as appropriate.
