

SUGGESTED TOPICS

- Access to Justice sessions may focus on criminal justice-related services and programs (victims and suspects/offenders)
- Building Strong Organizations sessions may focus on organizational development policies, practices to meet mission, individual giving, planned giving events, fundraising, membership financial sustainability, succession planning, marketing and branding, and personal/professional development
- Community Inclusion/Deinstitutionalization sessions may focus on transportation, housing, inclusive education, alternatives to traditional day services, social connections, policy, best practices, and stories related to these topics
- **Development** sessions may focus on sustainable development goals and international development efforts
- **Employment** sessions may focus on inclusive, competitive, and supported employment models from across the globe
- **Future Planning and Person Centered Planning** sessions may focus on financial asset building, supported decision making, guardianship, and creating/maintaining social connections
- **Grassroots Advocacy** sessions may focus on starting/sustaining a movement, engaging self-advocates and siblings, and use of social media
- **Health** sessions may focus on health disparities for people with I/DD, improving health care, partnering with health care professionals, educating parents, research, and dual diagnoses
- Intimacy sessions may focus on marriage, building relationships, intimate relations, sexuality, and parenting
- Public Policy sessions may focus on what's on the horizon, global issues, emerging issues, and model legislation
- **Supporting Families** sessions may focus on early intervention, transitioning, aging caregivers, community outreach, identifying needs, measuring results, innovative solutions, education advocacy, and community inclusion
- **Technology** sessions may focus on improving service delivery to people with I/DD via technology, enabling people with I/DD to advocate more powerfully with the help of technology, and enabling people with I/DD to be more fully included in the community via technology
