Paper Presentations

Authors are encouraged to submit abstracts that fit within the three broad thematic tracks. Potential topics are listed but the abstracts do not have to necessarily fit these example topics, just the track. Case studies must include what the author(s) has learned from this case study and why it is relevant to the conference.

Highest consideration will be given to abstracts that:

- Present compelling ideas, insights, principles, and lessons applicable to other projects.
- Are relevant to the conference theme and contribute to a conference track.
- Present new technology (or new applications of existing technology), analyses or ideas.
- Be currently and technically acceptable in practice, method, and theory.
- Offer stimulating thought or encourage dialogue and debate.
- Contain original research.
- Make a significant contribution to the body of knowledge in heritage preservation.

Submission Requirements

Each abstract should include:

- a title and description of your presentation (450 words or less);
- 4 learning objectives (30 words);
- 4 keywords;
- a short biography (100 words);
- indicate student status (if applicable); and
- represent a 15-20 minute presentation by one speaker.

Abstracts will be selected via a double-blind review process.

Requirements for Selected Presenters

Each presenter must:

- Confirm acceptance of the invitation to present;
- register for the conference (details and pricing forthcoming);
- work directly with your assigned session chair* (via email and/or phone);
- submit a final PowerPoint presentation and audio recording through the provided platform; and
- participate fully in the conference.

*Note: Each session will have 3-4 presenters and one session chair that organizes the session. APT Washington DC 2021 discourages more than one presenter for each 15-20-minute presentation. If a co-presenter is approved, he/she must register at the applicable rate.

Publication

All papers presented at the conference will be considered for publication in post-conference issues of the APT *Bulletin*. APT reserves the right to publish all accepted abstracts on their websites and with conference registration materials.
