

## **Clinical Updates**

Keeping up with the ever-expanding body of medical literature and changes to clinical practice guidelines can be challenging. The Clinical Updates track provides evidence-based updates from recent literature published in medicine subspecialty fields and specific topic areas that all hospitalists need to know in order to provide optimal management for specific conditions in hospitalized patients.

## **Co-Management/Perioperative Medicine**

The perioperative and consult medicine track explores the perioperative and consultative medicine questions that challenge hospitalists on a daily basis. This hospitalist core competency increases in complexity on a daily basis, and yet many physicians were not even taught the basics in residency.

## **Early-Career Hospitalists**

The Early Career Hospitalist Track has been designed for new hospitalists, resident physicians and medical students interested in pursuing a career in Hospital Medicine. Designed by SHM's physicians-in-training committee, which includes nationally recognized hospitalists with expertise in scholarship, career development, and medical education, this track aims to inspire future hospitalist leaders.

## **High Value Care**

Unnecessary care is not only wasteful and costly, but it can be harmful to patients as well. Our High Value Care (HVC) track will guide attendees on how to avoid diagnostic and therapeutic overuse and how to move towards the right care for every hospital medicine patient.

## **Medical Education**

This track is for hospitalists who are interested in improving their teaching skills. A strong teaching approach can impact and shape how learners think about and approach patient care for years to come.

Nurse Practitioners and Physician Assistants are critical to hospital medicine care delivery. This track will discuss best practices in NP/PA utilization and collaboration.

## **Palliative Care**

Hospitalists are optimally situated to provide palliative care to their patients. Patients are admitted to hospitals at turning points in a serious illness trajectory, when needs for pain and symptom management and navigation of prognosis and goals of care are high. The Palliative Care Track sessions provide the tools hospitalists need to understand their role in palliative care, and expertly manage pain and other common physical symptoms.

**Typical Session Length:** 40 minutes

**Typical Number of Speakers:** no more than 1-2

## **Pediatric**

The pediatric track will have a variety of clinical and systems-based topics relevant to pediatric hospitalists. Previous hot topics presented include understanding the febrile infant, acute behavioral inpatient emergencies and taking a different look at how the Pediatric Hospitalist Fellowship subspecialty certification affects various groups.

## **Rapid Fire**

The Rapid-Fire Track is designed to provide participants with “rapid bursts” of content and to address specific questions framed by the Annual Meeting Committee. The topics are very clinical and relevant to everyday inpatient practice.

## **The Great Debate**

The Great Debate Track pairs off two talented speakers to debate cutting edge clinical decisions on the front lines. By taking opposing sides of clinical decisions, the latest literature is reviewed, and best practices are discussed. The audience gets to vote on who they believe. Previous topics areas presented include perioperative, infectious diseases, and pulmonary.

## **Technology**

Hospitalists are at the forefront of innovation and perpetually exploring new ways to deliver safe and efficient care. The new and exciting Technology track is focused on current and future tech that will impact care delivery. Sessions in this track will inform attendees on the interface of hospitalists with telehealth and its future, as well as digital apps and wearables impacting physicians and patients. SHM has also taken significant leadership in Point of care ultrasound teaching and dissemination.

**Typical Session Length:** 40 minutes

## **Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion**

The Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) track builds upon the work of the society to eliminate health disparities for patients, practice active anti-racism and foster inclusive, equitable cultures. This track provides great learning and application tools to bring DEI to the forefront for individual hospitalists and their organizations.

**Typical Session Length:** 40 minutes

## **Leadership**

The Leadership track is designed for trainees, APPs, early career, mid-career, and seasoned hospitalists with an aim of holding leadership positions in hospitals or health care institutions. We are confident that our track will give you a unique opportunity for all attendees to learn, consider, and internalize various leadership skills and perspectives. Taught by experienced leaders in healthcare, this track attempts to provide some of the most essential tools you can take back to your routine to apply.

**Typical Session Length:** 40 minutes

## **Wellness and Resilience**

The wellness and resilience track offers content in a variety of areas of interest to hospitalists at all career stages that will offer concrete tips and guidance as well as knowledge-sharing from peers.

## **Health Policy**

These sessions will provide information about the processes of health policy development and implementation, and an overview of federal legislative and regulatory programs and processes that impact hospital medicine. Speakers will present the big picture of federal advocacy, the players, formal and informal approaches, and what hospitalists bring to the table.

## **Academic/Research**

This combined track is for hospitalists who practice in academic medical centers and face unique challenges, as well as for hospitalists in any setting interested in research. Also featured are oral presentations selected from the RIV abstracts receiving the top scores by reviewers. Every hospitalist, whether in a community or academic medical setting, who desires to bring greater rigor to their analysis as well as educational effectiveness will walk away from these sessions with new resources to implement.

**Typical Session Length:** 60 minutes

## **Practice Management**

The importance of organizational infrastructure related to the practice of hospital medicine is well recognized, and information in this area continues to accumulate.
