## GENERAL ABSTRACT SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

### Paper Presentations

Authors are encouraged to submit abstracts that fit within the three broad thematic tracks. Potential topics are listed but the abstracts do not have to necessarily fit these example topics, just the track. Case studies must include what the author(s) has learned from this case study and why it is relevant to the conference.

Highest consideration will be given to abstracts that:

- Present new technology (or new applications of existing technology), analyses or ideas.
- Present compelling ideas, insights, principles, and lessons applicable to other projects.
- Are relevant to the conference theme and contribute to a conference track.
- Be currently and technically acceptable in practice, method, and theory.
- Offer stimulating thought or encourage dialogue and debate.
- Contain original research.
- Make a significant contribution to the body of knowledge in heritage preservation.
- Material that has not been presented at another conference.

### Submission Requirements

Each abstract should represent a 15-to-20-minute presentation by one speaker and include:

- title (200 characters max)
- description of your presentation (400 words or less)
- 4 learning objectives (20-30 words each);
- 4 keywords
- short speaker biography (100 words)
- conference track most appropriate for your abstract
- your student status (if applicable)

*Abstracts will be selected via a double-blind review process.*

### Requirements for Selected Presenters

Each presenter must:

- Confirm acceptance of the invitation to present and sign the speaker agreement
- register/pay for the conference (details and pricing forthcoming)
- work directly with your assigned session chair\* (via email and/or phone)
- submit a final PowerPoint presentation through the provided platform
- participate fully in the conference by attending in person

*\*Note: Each session will have 3-4 presenters and one session chair that organizes the session. APT Seattle 2023 discourages more than one presenter for each 15-20-minute presentation. If a co-presenter is approved, he/she must register at the regular rate.*

### Publication

All papers presented at the conference will be considered for publication in post-conference issues of the APT *Bulletin*. APT reserves the right to publish all accepted abstracts on APT websites, with conference registration materials, and with any published conference proceedings.
